# In The Frame



**Kingscombe** made the long trip to Wolverhampton on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> October and rewarded each way backers when he finished 3<sup>rd</sup>, under top weight, in a 1 mile handicap. Available early on at 20/1 he was backed down to 12/1 before the off. Ridden by Seb Saunders, as Steve Drowne was unavailable, he ran wide, keeping out of the kickback, in 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> position for the majority of the race and he stayed on into 3<sup>rd</sup> place up the straight but was no match for the easy winner or the prominently ridden second being beaten 3 and a half lengths and 5 lengths.

**She's Humble** finished 4<sup>th</sup> in a 2 mile 6 furlong handicap chase at Fontwell earning (15/8/2013) earning £135.
